

Easy Guide to what you need to do **BEFORE** you start writing your **CDR**



Check your ANZSCO code

Check your ANZSCO code description before you start writing your Career Episodes. This is the official website that provides [ANZSCO codes information](#). Use search to find your profession.



Check your past projects

You need three projects to base your three Career Episodes on. If you have limited experience you can base one of your Career Episodes on your final year University Project.



Check that you have the design experience

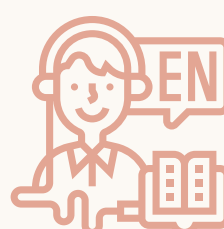
Most professions would require design activities / duties to be described in your Career Episodes (however, there are some exclusions). If you don't have the required design experience, please contact us and we will guide you through.



Download the booklet

Visit Engineers Australia website and download the "Prepare your migration skills assessment application" [booklet](#).

Notice that you only need to read sections appropriate for your Occupational Category.



English exam

In parallel to starting on your CDR, you need to organise and take your English Exam. You can make the CDR application after you completed and passed the English exam.

Details are given on page 3 of the booklet - please see previous step.



Allocate time for CDR writing

Allocate specific time in your diary, on a weekly basis for your CDR writing - this is a time consuming process.

Start writing from Career Episodes and also check the Summary Statement section so you are aware what needs to be covered in the Career Episodes.
